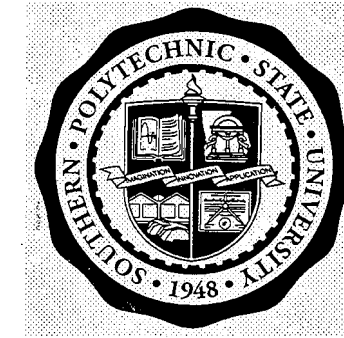
RELEASE STATEMENT

Southern Polytechnic State University Foundation, Inc. Application for The Jimmy Goldgeier Scholarship

The Jimmy Goldgeier Scholarship was established with the Southern Polytechnic State University Foundation in June of 2002 following the death of James L. "Jimmy" Goldgeier. The purpose of the scholarship is to recognize and assist deserving students majoring in architecture, and to provide a fitting and lasting tribute to the scholarship's namesake.

Jimmy Goldgeier

Born in New York in 1968, Jimmy grew up in Atlanta where he was active in the Atlanta Jewish community from a young age. He was a member of B'nai Brith Youth Organization; a staff counselor at Camp Isidore Alterman; a player in the Marcus Jewish Community Center of Atlanta, men's softball league; and, together with his wife, Ali Berliner, a volunteer at many Atlanta Jewish community events.

Jimmy received a Bachelor of Architecture degree from SPSU. He pursued this important goal in his life with tenacity and with dedication to becoming an architect, fulfilling his dream at graduation ceremonies in 1993. As a distinguished alumnus, he was asked to serve on the prestigious SPSU Architecture Advisory Board, an organization comprised of regional architectural and business leaders who lend their expertise to the SPSU Architecture Program and who mentor students within the Program. Prior to enrolling at SPSU, Jimmy attended the University of Florida where he was an active member of his fraternity, Tau Epsilon Phi.

Though his professional career was brief, Jimmy left his talented mark on many homes and buildings. Most notably, his design touches can be found in the Buckhead Village Loft and Mathieson Exchange Loft apartment buildings in Buckhead.

Jimmy volunteered his expertise to help Chabad of Alpharetta in the design and construction of the Chabad Center which has since been named the Jimmy Goldgeier Center.

Criteria

Each applicant must be a full-time student in his or her third or fourth year of study at the time of application, and in his or her fourth or fifth year of study pursuing a Bachelor of Architecture degree at the time of award. Each applicant must be in the 70th to 90th percentile in the Architecture Program. The percentile rankings will be based on cumulative GPA at the time of application. (The 90th percentile maximum will not apply to applicants seeking to renew the scholarship.)

Each applicant must write an essay of no more than 500 words explaining why he or she deserves the scholarship and how he or she embodies the spirit of Jimmy based on the information provided in Jimmy's biography. The essays will be reviewed by professors within the Architecture Program who serve on the scholarship selection committee. These professors will choose two applicants who they believe are most deserving of the scholarship based on each respective essay, design review, and charette projects.

When all other qualifications are considered equal among applicants, preference will be given to transfer students. Based upon satisfactory academic performance and compliance with criteria, the scholarship may be renewed until the recipient graduates, providing the recipient remains enrolled as a

full-time student. Scholarships will be awarded without regard for race, religion, marital status, gender, age or disability.
